# **Important Safety Instructions**



- 6. Clean only with dry cloth.
- Do not block any ventilation openings. Install in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves or other apparatus (including amplifiers) that produce heat.



# EXAMPLE OF ANTENNA GROUNDING ACCORDING TO NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE, ANSI/NFPA 70



Note to CATV system installer: This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

- 17. Wall or Ceiling Mounting The product should be mounted to a wall or ceiling only as recommended by the manufacturer and listed by an independent laboratory (such as UL).
- 18.Apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing and no objects filled with liquides, such as vases, shall be placed on the apparatus.

### Caution Installing Stand


- · Handling by two people is recommended when installing.
- · When holding (moving or lifting) the LCD TV, hold the display's body. Do not handle the LCD TV by holding the attached accessory parts (speakers), otherwise it may result in damage.
- · Before installing, provide a desk (or a part of it) which is strong enough to support the weight of the LCD TV and its stand. The desk must be larger than the LCD TV's screen size. The desk's surface must be flat and covered with soft material (such as a blanket) for protecting the screen surface.
- · Before putting the LCD TV on the desk, make sure there is no object on it. Leaving any object under the screen may cause damage on the screen.
- · The LCD TV with this stand should be installed on a flat and level place. Do not place it on non flat, unlevel or unstable cart or stand. The display may fall, causing not only serious damage to the products but serious injury to a person.

For correct installing, mounting and uninstalling of the LCD TV Stand, it is strongly recommended to use a trained, authorized dealer, Failure to follow correct procedures could result in damage to the equipment or injury to the installer.




#### **Installing Stand**

1. Place the LCD TV on a flat surface place where maintained with soft materials (such as a blanket) to protect the display screen.




2. Secure the stand-base to the LCD TV with 4 screws (M4x10) found in the accessory bag.



#### **WARNING:**

- · To prevent injury, this apparatus must be securely attached to the floor/wall in accordance with the installation instructions.
- · This LCD TV could fall over if it is pushed, pulled or knocked down. It would be safer to use a screw to secure the LCD TV to desktop.



### Wall Mounting (Optional)

Before mounting the LCD TV on wall, remove the 4 screws that were originally threaded into the wall mounting inserts on the back of your LCD TV.


- VESA standard interface: 400 x 400mm
- Screw type: M6x20



#### NOTE:

- 1. Wall mounting kit is not supplied.
- 2. Wall mounting kit shall be able to sustain at least 3 times of set weight.

We suggest that you keep your LCD TV at least 2.36 inches (60 mm) away from the wall to prevent cable interference and to make room for a better heat dissipation.






IMPORTANT: Wall mount kit must comply with VESA standard 400 x 400. All four (4) screws must be threaded to the wall mount and HDTV's back cabinet.


# **Getting Started**

# Install Batteries in the Remote Control


 Open the battery cover of the remote control by pressing down and pulling it.



 Insert two new AAA size batteries for the remote control. Make sure to match the + and - signs on the batteries with marks inside the remote control.



3. Close the battery cover until it clicks shut.





- Do not use rechargeables together with dry cells, other types, mixed new and old or batteries with different charge levels.
- Do not expose the remote control or batteries to moisture or heat such as sunshine.
- · Please recycle used up batteries.
- Remove the batteries if the remote control is not going to be used for an extended period of time.
- Danger of explosion if batteries are incorrectly replaced.
- Replace batteries only with the same or equivalent type.

# Operating Range of the Remote Control


Point the top of the remote control toward the TV's sensor within a distance of less than 6m/20ft, and a horizontal/vertical angle of less than 30 degrees.

The remote control may not function properly if the TV's sensor is under direct sunlight or strong illumination, or when there is obstacle in the path of signal transmission.



# Antenna Connection for Off-air Signals.

The tuner in this LCD TV can receive digital and analog off-air signals from an antenna, or analog or clear QAM cable channels from a direct Cable TV connection.




#### NOTES:

- You must use the On-screen Menu to Search for Clear QAM Cable channels. (see p.14)
- For the best picture, connect your Cable box or Satellite receiver to HDMI or component jacks.
- This LCD TV can receive ANT unscrambled RF signal being broadcasted.




#### Controls and Jacks



- VOL + / —: Turn up(+) or turn down(—) the audio volume. In the OSD Menu mode, move right(+) or move left(—) the menu selection.
- CH ∧ I ∨: Select the next(∧) or the previous(∨) channel. In the OSD Menu mode, move up(∧) or move down(∨) the menu selection.
- 3. MENU: Enter or exit the menu screen.
- 4. INPUT: Select the input source.
- 5. POWER: Turn the TV On or Off (standby).
- HDMI (HDMI1/DVI, HDMI2, HDMI3): Connect your HDMI devices.
- 7. PC IN: Connect your PC video.
- 8. PC/DVI IN AUDIO: Connect your PC/DVI audio (3.5mm stereo).
- COMPONENT/AV IN: Connect digital video equipment to the Video Green (Y), Blue (Pb), Red (Pr) jacks, and matching Audio White (L) and Red (R) jacks.
- **10. SPDIF:** Use a digital audio cable to connect stereo home theater system.

- ANTENNA/DTV/TV: Connect an RF antenna or Analog Cable system.
- **12. USB PORT**: Used for accessing JPEG photo files.

#### Wireless Remote Control



- 1. POWER Press to power on the TV.
- Numeric Buttons Press to select a channel.

Example: Press 6 then ENTER button to select channel 6. Press 6 and 1 then ENTER button to select channel 61.

- Button Press numeric button then press this button followed by the desired digital sub-channel.
- 4. CAPTION Press this button to switch CC mode among CC Off, CC On, and CC On When Mute. Digital Captions can be changed through the the Digital setting from Closed caption menu.
- AUDIO Press to select the desired audio mode. if available.

- VOLUME UP / DOWN (VOL +/ -) Press to decrease or increase the audio volume.
- 7. MUTE Press to mute or restore the sound.
- SLEEP Press to set Off Timer function among Off, 5, 10, 15, 30, 60, 90, 120, 180, or 240 minutes.

NOTE: The **Off Timer** will be canceled when the LCD TV is turned off or when a power failure occurs.

- PIX SHAPE Press to choose aspect ratio: Normal, Zoom, Wide, Cinema, or Auto. Available options depend on the signal and the aspect ratio of the broadcast.
- **10. MENU** Press to display on-screen menu.
- **11. INPUT** Press to select the input source to view.

#### 12. RECALL -

Initial Setup.

In TV mode: Press to switch between the last and current TV channel.

In none-TV mode: Press to switch between the last and current none-TV input-source

- 13. FAVORITE Accesses the Favorites channel.
- 14. RESET Press twice to display RESET menu. Select "Yes" to reset to Factory Default settings.
  NOTE: All the channel memory will be erased. You will have to run the Initial Setup again. Please refer to page 12 for running
- **15. CHANNEL UP / DOWN** (CH ∧ / ∨) Press to switch to the previous or next channel.
- **16. INFO** Press to display channel information hanner

Digital Banner may contain: Channel Number, Channel Title, Video Resolution, and Program Rating.

Analog Banner may contain: Channel Number, Channel Title, NTSC, and Program Rating.

- SOUND Press to select one of the preset audio modes: Standard, Movie, Music, News, or Custom.
- PICTURE Press to select one of the preset picture modes: Vivid, Natural, Standard, Cinema. or Custom.
- **19.** Cursor ▲ (UP) and ▼ (DOWN) Press to move the cursor up and down.

**Cursor** ◀ (LEFT) and ▶ (RIGHT) - Press to move the cursor left and right.

**ENTER** - Press to select an option from the menu, when required.

20. EXIT - Press to exit from the menu.


#### **HDMI to HDMI Connection**

Connect compatible Digital devices such as HD Cable Box, HD Satellite Receiver, DVD Player, and Game System.

HDMI-High-Definition Multimedia Interface.

This is a digital AV interface that accepts uncompressed video signals for the best picture quality possible. It supports HDCP copy protection and allows transmission of copyprotected digital content.


The signal can also include PCM audio, when available.



- Connect the HDMI input and your external device with HDMI cable.
- 2. Press the [INPUT] button to select [HDMI1], [HDMI2], or [HDMI3] as the input signal.

#### Component (YPbPr) Connection

Connect Digital devices such as a HD Cable Box, HD Satellite Receiver, DVD Player, and Game System.




- Connect a COMPONENT cable to the Green, Blue, and Red video jacks on the LCD TV and to your digital device as shown.
- 2. Connect an AUDIO cable to the matching White and Red audio jacks as shown.
- 3. Press the [INPUT] button to select [Component] as the input signal.




### **Video Connection (Shared With** Component-Y)

Composite connectors are included on your LCD TV to provide continued compatibility with older analog devices such as a VCR.






#### **D-Sub Connection**



- 1. Connect with RGB (D-Sub 15 Pin) video cable from the RGB output of your PC to the TV PC IN input.
- 2. For PC audio signal, connect with an analog audio cable from the audio output of your PC to the TV PC/DVI IN AUDIO input.
- 3. Press the [INPUT] button to select [PC] as the input signal.

#### **USB Connection**


Your LCD TV features a JPEG Photo Viewer that allows watching digital still pictures from your USB disk plugged to the USB slot at the side panel.



- 1. Plug your USB disk to the USB slot at the side panel.
- 2. Press the [INPUT] button to select [USB] as the input signal (see page 17 for detail).

#### **Power Connection**

- 1. Plug in AC power cord (120V AC, 60Hz)
- 2. Press the [POWER] button, (Follow the onscreen instructions).




### **Initial Setup**

For the first time after powering on your LCD TV, the Setup Wizard appears.

1. Select the language used for the OSD (On-Screen-Display) Menu.



Select either Home or Shop mode.



If later you want to change the mode, you can change it via the Home/Shop selection under Energy Options on the Setup menu (See page 16).

#### NOTE:

- The Home mode is intended for home use. and will save much energy.
- · Any menu or control changes in the Shop mode will not be saved when the LCD TV is turned off.



 Select the tuning band: Antenna for external antenna, Cable for cable system, or through your Set Top Box.



Press [ENTER] button to start the channel scan.



The channel scanning is now in process.
 The Setup Wizard shows the scanning process of digital channels first, and then the analog channels next.

The scanning process will show how many channels in total have been found. Please wait while the scanning process is searching for the available channels in your area.

To cancel the process, press [ENTER] button on the remote control



#### NOTE:

- Once you cancel the Setup Wizard, it will not be shown again.
- The Setup Wizard is done now. You may press [EXIT] button on the remote control to tune to the first detected channel right away.



# **OSD Menu Operation**

To enter the OSD (On-Screen Display):

- 1. Press [MENU] button on the remote control to display the OSD nenu.
- 2. Use the cursor buttons (▲ ▼ ◀ ▶) to highlight your selection.
- 3. Press [ENTER] button to confirm your selection
- 4. Press [EXIT] button to exit from any menu layer instantly.

#### Video Menu



#### □ Picture Mode

Enter this menu to select from preset picture settings to optimize your TV's performance.

- · Vivid: Provides enhanced picture contrast and sharpness for viewing in a well-lit room.
- · Natural: Provides a highly defined image for viewing in a normally-lit room.
- · Standard: Provides a less power consuming settings.
- · Cinema: Provides a soft, film-like picture for watching movies in a darkened room.
- · Custom: Any changes made to the other modes will be applied to this mode.

#### □ Brightness

Adjust picture brightness.

#### □ Contrast

Adjust picture contrast.

#### □ Color

Adjust picture color.

#### □ Advanced Video

Select advanced video settings.

- · Color Temperature: Selects a choice of Cool (blue). Normal. or Warm (red) color
- Noise Reduction: Set to reduce video
- · Tint: Adjust the hue (red, green, blue) of the picture.
- Sharpness: Set to enhance the picture detail.
- · Adaptive Contrast: Set to automatically adjust the picture detail and brightness.
- · Aspect Ratio: Adjust how the picture fills the screen
- Overscan: Set OFF to show the full image on the TV when connecting a computer. Set ON to show the full image on the TV when not connected with a computer
- · Backlight: Set the backlight brightness.





#### ■ Menu Language

Choose English, Spanish, or French for OSD language.

#### □ Parental Controls

Set TV parental controls. This function blocks out the picture and sound of the selected rating levels.

The factory preset password to enter the **Parental Controls** feature is a 4-digit number **QQQQ**.

- Button Lock: Lock or unlock all buttons on the TV's panel.
- Block Unrated TV: Block or unblock the unrated programs.
- **US**: Set the parental control level using the Movie Ratings or TV Ratings.
- Canada: Set the parental control level using the English Rating or French Rating.
- Change Password: Change the 4-digit password. You will have to enter the new password first and then enter again the new password to confirm. Make sure to keep your new password.
- Region 5: Use Region 5 to block various types of movies and television programs based on ratings systems used in the USA that you feel may be inappropriate due to its content. The Region 5 option will operate for Digital Channels (ATSC) only.
- Reset Region 5: Clear the downloaded RRT5 rating information and restore to the factory default settings.

#### □ Closed Caption

Adjust the Closed Caption settings. The options are: *CC Mode, Analog Captions, Digital Captions, Digital CC Settings.* 

#### □ Sleep Timer

Select how long the TV will take to automatically turn itself off. The options are: *Off*, *5*, *10*, *15*, *30*, *60*, *90*, *120*, *180*, and *240* minutes.

#### ☐ Input Labels

Create labels that match your TV's inputs to your external devices for easy identification.

#### PC Options

Only available for PC input with PC signal. You can adjust the PC input to match your PC or Laptop output with your TV. The options are: *Auto Adjust, H-Position, V-Position, Clock, Phase*, and *Reset PC Options*.

#### System Info

Displays the TV information.
