Safety Instructions

The following safety instructions have been included in compliance with safety standard regulations. Please read them carefully.

- Read Instructions All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the appliance is operated.
- Retain Instructions The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.
- 3. Heed Warnings Adhere to all warnings on the appliance and in the operating instructions.
- 4. Follow Instructions All operating and use instructions should be followed.

About the batteries


Cleaning

Clean the unit only by wiping it with a soft cloth. Never use any solvents, cleaning alcohol or chemical cleaners, since these may damage the finish and labelling, and lead to discoloration and deformation.

Packing material

We recommend that you retain the shipping carton and packing material of the unit, since these will be useful for renewed transport.

Voltage selector



If the model you have purchased is a version with voltage selector, be sure to confirm that the selector is set to the correct AC voltage used in your area. Check this before plugging the power cord into the AC outlet. If the selector is not set correctly, change the setting so that it matches your local AC voltage rating.

On CDs

Always observe the following points concerning CD use in order to avoid CD damage, jams, sound skipping, and breakdown.

- ► Do not insert the 8-cm (3-inch) CDs (CD Singles).
- ➤ Do not insert discs which are not round, such as novelty discs with octagonal or heart shape.
- ➤ Do not use any commercially available CD accessories (such as adapters for 3-inch CDs, disc stabilizers, disc protectors, cleaning discs etc.).
- ▶ Use only discs with a mark or similar, which indicates compliance with official Compact Disc standards.
- ▶ Some CDs may have a certain amount of flash (flaky plastic deposit resulting from the grinding process) near the center hole or the outer circumference. Remove any such remnants before using the disc, otherwise it may not be possible to eject the CD properly, or skipping may occur.
- ▶ CDs bearing labels or stickers with excess glue around the edges or CDs with glue residue from removed adhesive tape, stickers or similar may give problem during eject or cause other damage.
- Recordable CDs (CD-R) recorded on certain recorders cannot be played back with this unit.

Mechanism self-check operation

When the unit is used for the first time after purchase or for the first time in a long time, or when the mechanism is in certain states, the mechanism carries out self-check operations.


Transportation

Before moving or transporting the unit, be sure to remove all CDs to prevent the possibility of damage.

Other precautions

- ▶ Do not place an amplifier, television, or other heavy object on the unit. Otherwise deformation and breakdown may occur.
- Protect the unit from shocks and vibration. Shocks or strong vibrations during CD playback may cause damage to the discs.
- ► To avoid the possibility of hum interference, this unit should not be placed in close vicinity to other components.
- ▶ A sudden increase in the ambient temperature can cause moisture to condense on the optical lens of the laser pickup, making correct playback impossible. Condensation can be removed by turning on the power to the unit and letting it warm up for about 30 minutes to 1 hour.


Connections

Precautions

AC power cord connection

Disconnect the power cords of this unit and all other components from the AC outlets before making any connections. If you make connection with the power on, noise may be generated and damage the amplifier, speakers, or other equipment.

- ▶ Be careful not to mix up left and right channels. If the left and right channel connections are mixed up, the left and right audio is output reversed.
- ▶ White connectors are for the left channel and red connectors for the right channel of audio connections.
- ▶ The system remote function is possible to operate this unit for example from another room, by using an optional remote control sensor connected to the control center. In this case, the System Remote (CD or Tape) output of the Nakamichi control center must be connected to the System Remote input jack on this unit.



CAUTION

CAUTION

If the model you have purchased is a version with voltage selector, be sure to confirm that the selector is set to the correct AC voltage used in your area. Check this before plugging the power cord into the AC outlet. If the selector is not set correctly, change the setting so that it matches your local AC voltage rating.

Plug the power cord into an AC outlet rated for the voltage shown on the rear panel of the unit.

- ▶ Do not plug in the power cord if the voltage shown on the rear panel of the unit and the AC line voltage in your area do not match.
- ▶ Periodically inspect the power cord plug and the socket to make sure they are free of dust, dirt, etc. If they are dirty, unplug the power cord plug from the socket with dry hands, then clean off any dust, dirt etc.


If the unit is not to be used for an extended period (such as during a prolonged absence), be sure to disconnect the power cord.

Analog signal connection

The digital signals read from the CD are converted to analog signals by the D/A converter in the unit and output from the Analog Output terminal.


Digital signal connection

The digital signals read from the CD are output from the Digital Output terminal without passing through the D/A converter in the unit.




Using the coaxial digital cable

Switch on the Digital Output - Coaxial On/Off switch on the rear of the unit. If you switch off, no signals are output from Coaxial terminal.




Using the optical digital cable




Use of the Remote Control

Inserting the batteries



- 1 Remove the cover of the battery compartment on the rear of the remote control.
- 2 Insert the supplied two IEC R03 (size AAA) batteries into the compartment, with the polarity as shown.
- 3 Close the cover of the battery compartment.


Using the remote control



Point the transmitter of the remote control at the sensor on the MB-10 and press the desired operation button.

▶ When using a Nakamichi's amplifier or receiver with remote control, you can operate pointing the amplifier or the receiver remote control at the remote control sensor on this unit.

Inserting CDs



Before inserting the disc, press the power button to turn the unit on. (When the unit is turned on, the display lights up.)

1 Press the disc number button to select the disc number which you want to insert a disc.

A disc number for which no CD is loaded cannot be selected during CD playback. Stop playback, then select the number.

- 2 Press the eject button. (The dust cover opens.)

 CAUTION ► Do not open the dust cover by hand.
- and give it a slight push. (The disc will be automatically drawn into the unit, and the dust cover closes. The disc indicator lights up.)



Removing CDs



Before removing the disc, press the power button to turn the unit on. (When the unit is turned on, the display lights up.)


- 1 Press the disc number button to select the disc number which you want to remove a disc.
- 2 Press the eject button. (The dust cover opens automatically and the disc slides out.)

- 3 Remove the disc.
- 4 Repeat steps 1 and 3.
- 5 After removing the discs, press the eject button. (The dust cover closes.)

CD Playback




Before playing the disc, press the power button to turn the unit on. (When the unit is turned on, the display lights up.)

- 1 Press the disc number button on the unit or the remote control, or press the disc search button on the remote control to select the disc which you want to play. (The selected disc number is displayed.)
- 2 Press the play button on the unit or the remote control.



- ▶ If the contents of memory are not erased, the unit goes into memory play and normal playback is not possible.
- ► The disc number, the track number and the playing time are displayed. With each push of the time button on the remote control, the display cycles through the following modes.



CD playback stop

(MAIN) (IG

Press the stop button on the unit or the remote control.

CD playback pause

Press the pause button on the unit or the remote control, and press the play button to resume.

Another CD playback



Press the disc number button on the unit or the remote control, or press the disc search button on the remote control. (During playback, empty disc slots cannot be selected.)

Another track playback



Press the track number button on the remote control, and press the play button.

Skip to the start of the current track



Press the track search (I<) button on the unit or the remote control.

Reverse skip/Forward skip



Press the track search button on the unit or the remote control. Keep the button on the remote control depressed to perform fast skip.

Reverse cue/Forward cue






Keep the cueing button on the unit or the remote control depressed. When you release the button, the playback starts.


Using the headphone

(MAIN)

Connect the headphone to the headphone jack on the unit, and adjust the listening volume with the headphone level control.



Memory Play



You can program a sequence of tracks for playback in a desired order. Up to 50 tracks can be programmed into a sequence.

(To store into memory the songs for a disc that has just been loaded into this unit and not been played back at all, play back that CD for a few seconds to have the unit read in the disc information.)

1 Press the disc number button on the unit or the remote control, or press the disc search button on the remote control to select the CD with the track you want to enter into a program. (The selected disc number is displayed.)



2 Press the track search button on the unit or the remote control, or press the track number button on the remote control to enter the number of the desired track. (The selected track number is displayed.)

You can also select all tracks on the disc by pressing the disc number button again. In this case, no track number is displayed. The entire disc takes-up only one memory space.

- 3 Press the memory button on the remote control. (The memory indicator and the memory number light up.) If all tracks on the CD were selected, the indication "AL" appears on the track number display.
 - ▶ If you press the time button on the remote control while a memory number is displayed, the total memory time is displayed while the time button is held down.*

- 4 Repeat steps 1 to 3.
- 5 Press the play button on the unit or the remote control.

.....

Check the contents of the program



Press the memory call button on the remote control.

- ▶ With each push of the button, you can check the memory number, and the corresponding disc number and track number on the display.
- ▶ If you press the time button on the remote control while a memory number is displayed, the total time until then is displayed while the time button is held down.*

.....

Change the contents of the memory number



Press the memory call button on the remote control to call up the memory number on the display, and then perform steps 1 to 3.

Clear the memory program



Press the memory clear button on the remote control. (The memory indicator goes out.)

- ▶ Taking out the CD or switching off the power automatically erases the contents of memory.
- ▶ Ordinary regular playback, random play and all repeat play are not possible unless the contents of memory are erased.



Checking the memory remaining time




You can display the memory remaining time by pressing the time button on the remote control during memory play. To put out this display, press the time button until the display goes into time mode.

^{*} If a track with a number higher than 48 is included in the program, the total memory time is not displayed.



^{*} If the total memory time is greater than 99 minutes 59 seconds, the hundreds position of the memory display is not shown. For example if the total memory time is 132 minutes 47 seconds, "32:47" is displayed.

Random Play



You can play back all tracks on all inserted CDs in random order.

1 Press the stop button on the unit or the remote control.

(MAIN) (C

- 2 Press the random button on the remote control. (The random indicator lights up and random play starts.) Random play is not possible unless the contents of memory are erased.
- ▶ When the last track has been played, the unit enters the stop mode.

Skip to the next track



Press the random button on the remote control to skip to the next track in the random sequence.






Press the stop button on the unit or the remote control. (The

Repeat Play



This unit has three types of repeat play.

All Repeat Play

You can have the unit automatically repeat playback of all tracks on all inserted CDs.

Memory Repeat Play

You can have the unit automatically repeat a memorized track sequence.

Random Repeat Play


Random play continues endlessly until repeat mode is canceled.

- 1 Press the repeat button on the remote control. (The repeat indicator lights up.)
- **2** For all repeat play, start normal playback (see page 14). If the contents of memory are not erased, the unit goes into memory repeat play and all repeat play is not possible.
 - For memory repeat play, start memory play (see page 16). For random repeat play, start random play (see page 18).

To cancel the repeat mode



Press the repeat button on the remote control once more. (The repeat indicator goes out.)



Troubleshooting

Some apparent malfunctions may be remedied by simple checks as described below. If the problem persists, please contact your dealer or an authorized Nakamichi service center.

No power.

▶ Verify that the plug of the power cord is plugged properly into the AC outlet.

No sound.

- ▶ Verify that power is supplied to the amplifier or the receiver.
- ▶ Verify that input selector of the amplifier or the receiver is set to the desired source.
- ▶ Verify that volume level of the amplifier or the receiver is set to a suitable position.
- ▶ Turn off the CD player and other components, and check all connections.

After insertion, a disc is ejected again.

▶ The disc was inserted upside down. Insert the disc with the label facing up.

Disc playback is not possible, sound is unstable, or skipping occurs.

- ▶ If the disc is dirty, clean it.
- ▶ If the disc is scratched, use another disc.
- ▶ Turn off the CD player and other components, and check all connections.
- ▶ Moisture may have condensed on the pickup lens. Turn the unit on and let the unit warm up for about 30 minutes to one hour.

Hum noise is heard.

▶ Turn off the CD player and other components, and check all connections.

Memory play is not possible.

▶ The contents of the memory may have been lost. Repeat the memory programming procedure.

.....

No signal appears at the digital output.

- ▶ Set the Digital Output Coaxial switch to On for coaxial output.
- ▶ Turn off the CD player and other components, and check all connections.

The remote control does not operate.

- ▶ Verify that power is supplied to the MB-10.
- ▶ Verify that batteries are inserted properly.
- ▶ Replace both batteries with fresh ones.
- ▶ Point remote control at sensor when operating.
- ▶ Remove any obstacles between remote control and MB-10.
- ▶ Do not operate remote control units of other equipment at the same time.

"Er" indication appears.

► Turn the unit off and then on again.


